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# Praise and reward

Just some advice on what teachers do.

Encouragement and a feeling of success really aid motivation. Praise real effort. When praising work, make it specific, linked to the work. 'That is very good because you ... '

If you give feedback in terms of where next, make it specific: 'this went well, but it could be even better if  $\dots$  '

This is a time when we can really develop the independence of the girls. Where you can, ask them: what went well, what could you do better next time? How did you assess your own work? Ask them which Junior School Habits have they applied. Use your judgement according to the age of your daughter.

Rewards work best when the timeframe for earning them is known, the purpose behind them is clear, and they are properly earned. Teachers in Year 1-6 give Achievement Marks (AMs), among a host of other reward systems we use across Junior School. Why not work with your daughter to construct one?

That said, an unexpected reward also works a treat.

### Looking after the girls and yourselves

The school will be sending advice to all staff and parents about how to maintain their own wellbeing at this very challenging time.

### **Reports and assessments**

Reports are sent remotely, so our plan is that these will go out as normal in a couple of weeks. Like all advice, this could change depending on current circumstances.

Please do not write to teachers during the Easter holidays with report queries. They will be back on email when 'virtual term' resumes on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> April.

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Targets will be included in the school report, as these are based on everything teachers see. No data will accompany these targets, as it was impossible to complete assessments this week.

## Miss Carr:

Miss Carr has quickly established herself as a much-loved teacher among the girls, particularly in 5CM. They have been asking after her.

Miss Carr will continue to work for NWC for the time being, supporting our Guided Home Learning Programme. If circumstances allow, we will arrange a time for her to say goodbye to the girls.

It has been poignant talking to the girls this week. They are feeling loss at the closure of school, at the same time affirming the sense of community which makes NWC special.
