

#### **CONGRATULATIONS TO MS ANNETTS**



Author's Licensing and Collecting Society (ALCS) Educational Writers Award 2020

I was very fortunate to have been involved with the ALCS Educational Writers Award this year as one of the judges. The ALCS Educational Writers Award is administered by Society of Authors. The award is presented for a book published covering primary and secondary age groups in alternate years. This year it was awarded for the 11-18 age range for an outstanding example of traditionally published non-fiction (with or without illustrations) that stimulates and enhances learning. It is the UK's only award for creative educational writing and this is the 13<sup>th</sup> year it has been running

Over 60 books were shortlisted this year and we were asked to draw up a long list of 10 - 15 books each before meeting to discuss and decide on a short list of five titles and agree a winner and runner up.

The shortlist was announced in November and the winner and runner up announced in an online video on Wednesday 9 December. The winning title is 'Black History Matters' by Robin Walker and the runner up is 'How to be autistic' by Charlotte Amelia Poe.

#### **Limitless Learning Academic Book Club**







#### **BLUESTOCKINGS SOCIETY**



Year 8 have started their 'Upcycling' project and have been leaning about recycling and reducing their own carbon footprints. Great title pages girls!











Year 8 have produced some lovely applique samples! Well done Anjali, Riva, Anjum and Safa!!
